

Foundation distributes grant funds

The McCook Community Foundation Fund, an affiliated fund of the Nebraska Community Foundation, was the recipient of an Emergency Relief grant from the Peter Kiewit Foundation. The purpose of the grant was to help organizations meet essential human needs. This is the second year that the MCFF has been chosen to receive the funds.

MCFF allocated the grant dollars to several local, charitable organizations that meet emergency food and energy assistance needs in this area. The four organizations receiving the grant funds were The McCook Pantry — \$4,500; United Methodist Church Feeding His Flock Thursday Night Supper — \$2,500; Share the Heat — \$3,500; and the Commodity Supplemental Food Program — \$500.
