Over the next 10 years in Nebraska, more than **\$100 billion** will transfer from one generation to the next. In 50 years, that number exceeds **\$950 billion**. This phenomenon has come to be known as the intergenerational transfer of wealth. There is always a transfer from generation to generation, as parents pass away and leave their estate to their children. But if the heirs no longer live where they grew up, that wealth may leave as well.

THE OPPORTUNITY IS MASSIVE


Over the next 10 years in Loup County, \$95 million will transfer from one generation to the next. In 50 years, that number exceeds \$945 million. The wealth may be held in real estate, securities, retirement accounts, and other assets. Some will go to taxes. Most will go to heirs. Due

to outmigration, many of those heirs no longer live where the wealth was built and may no longer feel connected to those places. Once wealth leaves our communities, the opportunity for give-back becomes more and more unlikely.
